The HSC Health Care System CEO Announces Retirement

Washington, D.C. (June 14, 2016) – The HSC Health Care System today announced that its president and CEO, [Thomas W. Chapman, MPH, EdD](#), will retire from his position, effective April 30, 2017. Dr. Chapman has served as a longtime leader of The HSC Foundation, the parent company of The HSC Health Care System, for nearly 20 years.

His departure caps a distinguished career in health care administration. Since 1998, Dr. Chapman has initiated the implementation and expansion of a wide range of community-based programs within The HSC Health Care System, working specifically to address the social determinants that often prevent access to health services, and the development of a [National Youth Transitions Center](#).

Prior to joining The HSC Foundation, Dr. Chapman served as a senior associate vice president for network development and professor of health services management and policy at The George Washington University; chief executive officer at The George Washington University Hospital; and president of the Greater Southeast Healthcare System. Dr. Chapman is also a current board member of Goodwill of Greater Washington, the Institute for Healthcare Improvement and Kaiser Permanente (Mid-Atlantic).
