The HSC Health Care System Introduces New Executive Team

*New Leadership Champions Collaboration with Providers, Families and Communities;
Expands Care for Individuals with Complex Health Needs*

Washington, D.C. (June 6, 2017) – Today, The HSC Health Care System (HSC) announces a new executive team that will lead the organization in its effort to strengthen the coordination and delivery of services for individuals with complex health needs in the Washington, D.C. region.

Dr. Nathaniel Beers assumed the role of CEO and President of HSC on May 1, 2017. In his first month as CEO, Beers selected several new executive team members to lead the effort. This team will improve systems and processes across the HSC network to advocate for and meet the needs of patients, providers and community partners.

“For nearly 135 years, HSC has focused on ensuring children and youth with disabilities receive expert medical care,” said Beers. “As the health care environment and delivery system evolves towards value-based care, HSC is committed to adapting and expanding our relationships with providers to collaboratively meet our families’ ever-changing health care needs. The new executive team includes:

- Josephine Bias Robinson, Executive Vice President of External Affairs;
- Raymond Vicks, Chief Financial Officer; and
- H. Bradley Weaver, Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Health Services for Children with Special Needs.

Anthony is charged with leading the development of an integrated clinical strategy that will help HSC grow the activities of The HSC Pediatric Center and HSC Home Care. She most recently served as the Assistant Superintendent of Health & Wellness at the D.C. Office of the State Superintendent of Education, where she oversaw all health and wellness programs for the public education system. In this role, she supervised the implementation of federal and local grant programs, including federal nutrition programs in schools and child care centers across the District. Anthony has conducted research on prenatal care and cultural



competence in hospitals and health systems, and was instrumental in the opening of Early Stages, the District's early childhood special education evaluation center.

Weaver joins HSC from Health Integrated, Inc. where he served as President and Chief Operating Officer. He brings over 25 years of experience in leading Medicaid and Medicare health care organizations in growth and development of new clinical programs and services. Weaver adds a specialized expertise in helping organizations achieve success through transforming its service delivery model, improving operational and financial performance, and increasing member satisfaction.

Bias Robinson and Vicks move from their current leadership positions, to members of the executive team. HSC is also pleased to welcome four new board members; including Larry Bailey, Anna Pilskaya Dunn, Josef Reum and Stephen Riley.
