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Health Services for Children with Special Needs, Inc. (HSCSN) Awarded Three Year NCQA Accreditation for Care Management Program

HSCSN Care Management (CM) and Quality teams receive the highest level of Case Management accreditation status.

Washington, D.C. (August 10, 2018) – On August 2, 2018 HSCSN, D.C.'s only dedicated health plan for children with special needs, received a three year National Committee on Quality Assurance (NCQA) Case Management Accreditation for their Complex Care Management (CM) Program.

NCQA's Case Management Accreditation Program is used to align goals and approaches to case management across payers and providers. Only organizations that demonstrate strong performance of the functions outlined in the standards for Case Management accreditation are awarded this status.
